To assist in guiding each individual to the highest level of attainment where s/he is capable of setting and adhering to high standards of performance. This is done by careful evaluation of each individual's capabilities for the purpose of his/her proper placement by means of teachers' recommendations, parental conferences, tests, and student interests.3. To place students in proper learning levels whenever it is deemed intellectually and/or socially desirable. Decisions are made as a result of advice or pupil service specialists in the fields of speech, hearing, and psychology.4. To develop respect for moral and spiritual values upon which our democracy was founded. This we strive to accomplish through various school activities such as assemblies, clubs, charitable projects, and other social activities.5. To develop and intensify in all individuals those habits of self-discipline and that regard for the rights of others which are part of our obligation to our creator and to our fellow beings. These things are done through the activities, and the conduct of classes.6. To provide a learning climate for the growth of creativity in each individual so that s/he will be prepared for the more exacting requirements of living in a changing scientific-technological society. This climate is fostered by students' participation in industrial and fine arts, science, language, home economics, office laboratories, and in club activities.7. To prepare our people to recognize change as an inevitable element of life, to meet new conditions with resourcefulness and self-assurance. This is an integral part of lesson plans growing out of each planned instruction.8. To provide the individual with cultural values, moral, spiritual, aesthetic, and human, through the effective study of literature, art, and music, and at the same time, provide for the enrichment of leisure time. This is done through choral and band activities, art, and literature courses.9. To inculcate health habits through an effective study of health needs in planning work and play, and through emphasizing the importance of cooperation between home and community in safeguarding and promoting general health. Home visits
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by the nurse and home and school visitor, physical education courses, driver education, cafeteria services, physical examinations, bus transportation, home economics, and related club activity help to attain this objective.

10. To assist the individual to develop desirable attitudes toward an understanding of the problem of family living so that s/he may realize a worthy home membership. Although special emphasis is given in the certain classes, this, as in Number 7, is an integral part of lesson plans growing out of each planned instruction.
